## Letter From The President

**Happy New Year!**

**We hope that 2019 was good to you and your family and friends (2 legged and 4 legged). We also hope you have survived and enjoyed the holiday season.**

**With the cold weather in many parts of the country, be sure to think about safety and your pups:**

- **Keep your Greyhound warm.** They may need a fleece/pajamas if you keep your home cool and as the temps get closer to freezing, they will likely need a coat outside for walks or adventures in the yard. Know your dog and the activities you will be doing – some will want a coat when the weather dips below 50 and others won't want a coat unless it is near freezing. And if you are going to be standing around, the need for a coat of some sort will be greater.
- **When ice and snow are on the ground in many areas, be aware that your dog's pads will get cold FAST.** Take them for shorter walks, or buy some booties to cover up those tootsies. (You may also get some interesting video footage for your files of the first time your dog wears them!). Booties will help not only with the cold, but to keep salt and chemicals off of your pet's feet as well as prevent cuts from ice along your walking route. If pets lick salt and chemicals off their feet, they can become ill. If you're not using booties, be sure to rinse your Greyhound's feet off with cool water when you get home to remove any residue.
- **Check your gates:** buildup of snow or ice may prevent your gates from closing correctly. Also, the winds in many areas will blow open gates. Please make sure your gates are closed and latched before letting your dog out in the yard.
- **For those winter walks, be sure you and your dog can be seen in the darker hours – wear bright/light clothing.**

**2019 was a super busy year for us. We did 215 adoptions in 2019 – WOW!!! We brought in 180 dogs from the USA, South Korea, the United Arab Emirates, and Israel. We also brought in our first retired racers from Australia. We continue to work with our contacts within the USA to bring as many dos as possible to GPI. But with the remaining Florida tracks closing before the end of 2020, the available NGA dogs are considerably fewer.**

**As we previously told you, our costs have increased. Effective January 1, 2020 we have had to raise our adoption donation to help in offsetting the costs. We continue to pursue other sources of funding wherever possible.**

**Be sure to check out our currently available dogs, including our January Dogs of the Month – Troy, Dana and Star – help us find them their forever homes this month!!**

**We want to thank our very generous donors and volunteers!! Without you we couldn't do what we do. We so appreciate your support of GPI and the dogs.**

## Who We Are - Dr. Cindy Glover - By Michele Palmer

### ***A Renaissance woman***

If you’ve seen Dr. Cindy Glover working at GPI, you may already be familiar with canine acupuncture. And if you’ve spoken with Cindy, you already know that she is a talented woman with many interests.

Since 2013, her mobile—yes, mobile!—veterinary practice, LunarPoodle Veterinary Services, has been providing in-home veterinary care for pets. She’ll come to your home to provide acupuncture, exams, laser therapy, and massage. Imagine how much more relaxing it is for your pet to receive care in the comfort of home.

Her veterinary practice and her personal life are expressions of Cindy’s belief that maintaining a healthy balance is the key to good health. Her curiosity about the world around her inspires her to learn new things and to integrate her knowledge and skills into her personal and professional life. She’s fun, interesting, and easy to engage in conversation.

### ***Early years in the Midwest***

Cindy was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and lived there until she moved to Port Clinton, Ohio, the self-proclaimed “Walleye Capital of the World.” Although Port Clinton is quite small, it was the source of one of Cindy’s many passions in life: fencing. (No, not the kind GPI requires for a site visit prior to adoptions.) Her high school World Culture teacher had talked about the Renaissance: the arts, science, philosophy, learning . . . and fencing. Cindy was intrigued by the concept; even in her teens, she was becoming a polymath. Luckily, tiny Port Clinton had a fencing club. Unfortunately, the club didn’t last long, so Cindy’s interest in fencing was back-burnered temporarily.

### ***Engineering school***

She moved back to Ann Arbor to attend the University of Michigan and study aerospace engineering, which is where she met Rick Glover, the man destined to become her husband. Both of them were active in the Astronomy Club, and it was there, in fact, that the term “lunar poodle” worked its way into her consciousness. (If you don’t know what the lunar poodle looks like, you can see it for yourself during the next full moon. Or just Google it.)

As part of their graduate work, they worked on the space shuttle program. By 1991 or so, both were looking for something else. Cindy had been taking riding lessons in her spare time, and had become interested in the health of the horses and the various maladies that can plague them, such as laminitis, which is an inflammation of the soft tissue of a horse’s hoof, and anhidrosis, which is the inability to sweat. Cindy chanced to see a Texas A&M University brochure and, curious as always, started looking at the programs offered.

### ***Space was not the final frontier***

Veterinary Medicine piqued the interest of this aerospace engineer. Her parents thought she had lost her mind—after all, this didn’t seem like a natural career progression. Even Cindy was a bit apprehensive. But when she looked at the requirements, she realized that her strong foundation in math and science would fulfill many of the program’s requirements. So, what sounded odd at first turned out to be a perfect fit.

Rick was also eager for a change, so he, too, took a leap in a different direction: he went off to Gonzaga to study law. Separated by 2,000 miles, they had long chats during the school year and then a long drive during the summers. Cindy would fly up to Spokane in the summer, help him pack up, and drive back to Texas. In the fall, they’d reverse the process. She worked in the pathology lab, and graduated from Texas A & M College of Veterinary Medicine in 1997.

## Who We Are - Dr. Cindy Glover - By Michele Palmer (con't)

### *Next stop: Juneau, Alaska*

After graduation, Cindy responded to an ad for a position in Juneau, Alaska. She got the job and they moved to Alaska's capital, which is accessible only by plane or by boat. Cindy's work that year focused on companion animals, often performing telephone triage for people in remote areas who needed medical help for their pets. She recalls a man who called because his dog had been in a fight with something, and was pretty beat up. She asked him, "What do you have in your medicine cabinet?" Her goal was to help the man stabilize his dog and relieve his pain until he could be brought in to Juneau.

Juneau is an interesting but remote city. Cindy loved the natural beauty, the breathtaking views of water and mountains, and the wildlife. But not much happens there. She told me, with a grin, about a police officer chasing some scofflaw down Egan Drive. "There's just nowhere to go! Nowhere to hide," she said. You can drive south for about 15 miles until the road dead ends in the forest, or drive north where the road dead ends near Point Bridget State Park. That's it.

### *Moving to the Seattle area*

Meanwhile, Rick decided he wanted to study patent law and found a job in Renton. They moved to the Seattle area, where Cindy worked at a feline practice. Being in a larger metropolitan area meant that, among other things, college classes were plentiful. Bellevue College offered a fencing class, which launched both Cindy and Rick into the world of fencing. Within two months, they were hooked, and started entering competitions. They travelled across the U.S. to compete, including at Nationals.

### *From traditional veterinary medicine to . . .*

People frequently asked Cindy questions about herbal medicines or more "natural treatments" for their pets, and she wanted to have definitive answers. She continued to take additional training in different modalities that would benefit her patients. When I asked Cindy how she ended up combining traditional Western veterinary medicine with traditional Chinese veterinary medicine, she said "Small details can change your life."

She gave me two examples. There was a cat with urinary blockage whose recurring problem inspired her to investigate how an alfalfa supplement the cat's owner had given the cat was affecting the cat's health. Thus began her interest in herbal medicine.

A second incident that changed and enriched her life and her practice came from the kung fu class she was taking. Not everyone would connect breathing exercises, self-defense, and meridians (the energy pathways in our bodies) with their veterinary practice. But Cindy did. Always keen to learn more ways to help animals, she went back to school to learn veterinary acupuncture, among other things.

### *Falling for greyhounds*

Cindy met her first greyhound at a Petco Meet & Greet. Soon she had a home visit from our cherished volunteer, Marchet Anshell. That's how Indigo became a part of the Glover family, and it's been an all-greyhound family ever since. Cindy and Rick have adopted a total of eight greys.

In 2013, Cindy started volunteering at GPI. She wanted to provide free acupuncture for dogs in the kennel, and how could anyone say no to that? She volunteers almost every week, usually on Thursday afternoons. When I asked her what it was like to have companion animals as patients, she likened it to being a pediatrician: your patients don't talk, they aren't coming to see you of their own volition, and sometimes they clamp their teeth and refuse to open their mouths.

### *What's next?*

Cindy's wide-ranging interests pretty much guarantee that she will continue to pursue diverse topics and somehow manage to combine them in unusual and helpful ways. "I would start a foundation, if I won the lottery," she said, to help older adults keep moving and stay active. She could imagine developing fencing classes for seniors because she believes she'll be fencing into her 80s or even beyond. She thinks fencing is ideal for seniors because it combines movement with intellectual stimulation. The moves in fencing are specific and well known, so fencing is "like figuring out a puzzle."

I don't know whether Cindy actually buys lottery tickets. But I do know that GPI has already won the lottery: we have Dr. Cindy Glover as a volunteer. She is smart and kind-hearted, gentle and truly interested in providing the best possible care for the animals you entrust to her care.

## Blood Donors Needed in the Vancouver, BC Area

Can your dog help a fellow furry friend survive an illness or serious trauma? Every day pets, just like yours, need blood transfusions and the Animal Emergency Clinic of the Fraser Valley operates a canine and feline blood donor program.


A pet may require a blood transfusion for several reasons. Bleeding caused by trauma like a car accident, cancer, bleeding disorders and toxic ingestions are but a few. In many cases, the probability of survival is greatly increased if blood products are available.

There is often a lack of sufficient blood products in the Lower Mainland and AECFV is always looking for new donors.

Greyhounds make great donors and are often the universal blood type. Due to age, we have 2 Greyhounds leaving our program in the next few months and we need more universal blood.

### Criteria to Enter the Program

- Must be between the ages of 1 and 6 yrs old to enter the program
- Body weight greater than 30 lbs
- Good physical condition and temperament
- No previous transfusions
- Heartworm negative
- Fed a premium quality (no raw diets please)

## Canine Dilated Cardiomyopathy

You may have been reading or have heard about DCM (Dilated Cardiomyopathy) related to certain dog foods, particularly those that are grain free and contain a high percentage of peas, lentils or other legumes. If you have not educated yourself on this subject as yet, we encourage you to do so and speak with your vet about the best dietary options for your dog.

The basics (from the FDA report) are that the FDA is currently investigating reports of “canine dilated cardiomyopathy (DCM) in dogs eating certain pet foods, many labeled as “grain-free,” which contained a high proportion of peas, lentils, other legume seeds (pulses), and/or potatoes in various forms (whole, flour, protein, etc.) as main ingredients (listed within the first 10 ingredients in the ingredient list, before vitamins and minerals). Many of these case reports included breeds of dogs not previously known to have a genetic predisposition to the disease. The FDA’s Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM) and the Veterinary Laboratory Investigation and Response Network (Vet-LIRN), a collaboration of government and veterinary diagnostic laboratories, continue to investigate this potential association. Based on the data collected and analyzed thus far, the agency believes that the potential association between diet and DCM in dogs is a complex scientific issue that may involve multiple factors.”



## Heartship Medical Fund

The Heartship Medical Fund has been established to help GPI adopters with medical expenses for a greyhound when an adopter is unable to find sufficient funds to provide necessary care. The Heartship Fund exists to help prevent returning a dog due to a medical catastrophe and provides a resource that might help keep the greyhound at home and the family together.

### Eligibility and Guidelines

- The adopter must complete a Heartship Medical Fund Application.
- The dog must have been adopted from GPI.
- Eligible medical conditions are treatable injuries or diseases.
- Medical conditions that are not eligible include amputation and chemotherapy for cancer diagnoses, terminal illness, elective medical care, and injuries resulting from owner negligence, including but not limited to dog park accidents.

## Medical Challenges

Are you struggling with medical issues with your greyhound? Be sure to give us a call. We periodically hear of families that are struggling with medical issues with their greyhound and the associated high vet expenses. Although well meaning, some vets are unfamiliar with greyhounds’ idiosyncrasies and do un-needed tests and treatments. We are happy to share information and our greyhound savvy vets are more than willing to share their knowledge with other vets or offer a second opinion.

Some of the more common mis-diagnoses we see are:

- A greyhound is limping and a vet will treat with all kinds of pain meds, xrays, etc., when it is simply a case of corns.
- A greyhound is being treated for low thyroid when the readings are normal for a greyhound
- A greyhound with a high creatinine reading is being treated for kidney failure when the level is normal for a greyhound
- A greyhound is being treated for consistent loose stools and/or “IBD” when it turns out the dog has hookworm.

So give us a call and let’s figure out if we can help.

## INTESTINAL PARASITES

Have you done an intestinal parasite screen on your dog in the last year? If not, now is the time. Take a fecal sample in to your vet and have it checked.

An otherwise healthy and normal looking dog can be harboring intestinal parasites such as Hookworm which can compromise your dog’s health over time.

Does your dog have loose stools, a grumbly tummy, or blood in their stools? If so, have an intestinal parasite screening done on your dog – take a fecal sample in to your vet and have it checked.

### ~ What should I do if my Greyhound gets loose?

- Call the GPI toll free number IMMEDIATELY!! 877-468-7681 (enter us as a contact in your cell phone). We will get a search party organized, post it on our website and social media pages, and alert folks your dog is missing
- Take a squawker (available at the GPI Rootique) and your CELL PHONE with you when you start your search. If your home phone number is on your dog's tags, make sure someone is available at that number as well in case a good Samaritan finds your pup.
- Have a Missing Dog flyer with your dog's picture on your computer ready to print and post at a moment's notice.

~ **Why is a collar and GPI tag important?** If your greyhound gets lost, the toll free number can be called and we can help get your dog back to you faster. Plus, if you've moved and haven't updated your phone/address tag, then GPI's toll free number could be the only way your greyhound is safely returned to you. Without a collar and ID tags, it is much harder to locate and reunite you. Please keep your dog's tags current and update GPI about any phone or address changes.

If you don't like the sound of the tags jingling, try a tag bag, an elastic band around the tags, or some of the rubber bumpers for keys around each tag. But please do not leave your dog without a collar and tags. Your dog's life may depend upon those tags.

All current GPI dogs are microchipped and registered to GPI, as a backup safety net, but if found, someone has to get the dog to a place that can read the microchip before we can try and reunite you and your dog.

## Super Simple Sweet Potato Dog Treats

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 sweet potato
- 2 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1/4 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 2 eggs

### **Method:**

- 1) Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Prick sweet potato several times with a fork.
- 2) Heat sweet potato in a microwave on high until tender, about 6 minutes. Cut potato in half and scoop flesh out of the skin into a bowl; discard skin. Mash potato with a fork or potato masher and transfer about 1 cup to a large bowl. Save any remaining sweet potato for another use.
- 3) Mix whole wheat flour, applesauce, and eggs in the large bowl with the sweet potato until a dough forms. Turn dough out on a well-floured surface and roll dough to about 1/2-inch thick. Cut out shapes using a cookie cutter or cut dough into strips with a pizza cutter. Arrange cookies on an ungreased baking sheet.
- 4) Bake until crisp, 35 to 45 minutes. Cool in the pans for 10 minutes before removing to cool completely on a wire rack.


